The purpose of the Connectional Table (CT) is for the discernment and articulation of the vision of the church and the stewardship of the mission, ministries, and resources of The United Methodist Church as determined by the actions of the General Conference and in consultation with the Council of Bishops. Par. 904 BOD





As part of the total mission of the church, the CT is to serve as a steward of the vision and resources for mission and ministry, provide fiscal responsibility, and establish policies and procedures to carry out the mission of the church. (904 BOD)

Provides a forum for understanding and implementing the vision, mission and ministries of The UMC in consultation with the Council of Bishops and consistent with the actions of General Conference





OBJECTIVE TWO

Enables the flow of information and communication





OBJECTIVE THREE

Coordinates the program life of the church with the mandates of the Gospel, The UMC's mission and global needs





OBJECTIVE FOUR & FIVE

Evaluates the missional effectiveness of program agencies and connectional structures and recommends changes for denominational effectiveness

Provides leadership in planning and research to evaluate needs and plan strategies





OBJECTIVE SEVEN


Collaborates with the General Council on Finance and Administration


